The truth about the Central States Synod:


112 of 153 congregations in synod are served by shared or part time clergy, or by lay leaders (73%)

- 44 share pastors
- 35 served on part time basis
- 33 served by SAMs or lay leaders
- 41 served by full time pastors

Average attendance across 153 congregations

- 36 congregations: 1-25
- 39 congregations: 26-50 (25%) **SOTH**
- 36 congregations: 51-100
- 12 congregations: 101-150
- 3 congregating 6: 151-200
- 4 congregations: 201+ (largest = 309)
 - 73% of congregations worship less than 100

Churches all over are finding it harder to support mission and ministry on offerings alone.

The truth about where SOTH is:

- Our current model for ministry is NOT sustainable.
- We are still doing good ministry inside and outside the church.
- We have invested partners in the Great Rivers Collaborative.
- We have congregations interested in collaboration.

Types of Collaboration:

- Cooperative Ministries (like CHM)
- Staff Sharing (could be treasurer)
- Yoking (retain autonomy council, constitution, budget, etc.)
- Merger (creating a new congregation)
