
Rally Sunday September 16



Sundays in September

Our summer series on St. Peter concludes:

O ver the summer, our Sunday Scriptures have examined the story of St. Peter in the Bible. We began with stories of Peter and Jesus in the gospels; next we spent five weeks on the New Testament letter of 1 Peter; finally we have considered stories of Peter and the early church, mostly from the book of Acts. The final week in this series will be Sept. 2. We will conclude by placing all of the rocks that peo-

ple have brought to worship into a cross in the flower garden at the south entrance. If you have not yet brought a stone with your name on it, please do so by that Sunday so that it can be included. The cross will remind us of Peter's words: "Come to him (Christ), a living stone...and like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. (1 Peter 2:4-5)"

Beginning on Sept. 9, we will begin another year of the narrative lectionary, which gives an overview of the Biblical story from beginning to end. **The scriptures for September will be:**

Sept. 9: Creation: Genesis 2:4b-7, 15-17; 3:1-8

Sept. 16: Abraham: Genesis 15:1-6

Sept. 23: Joseph: Genesis 37:3-8, 26-34; 50:15-21

Sept. 30: Exodus: Exodus 12:1-13; 13:1-8
