

#### Lent 2013 "Journey with the Cross"

#### A Word from the Pastor...

Weeks before Easter can be a strange, yet powerful time in a person's journey of faith. But because of its uniqueness, Lent can often be misunderstood. So here are a few things it's good to know about Lent:

#### Anglo-Saxon for "spring"

As early as the mid-fourth century, Christians have observed a time of preparation before the Easter celebration. The Lenten season begins on Ash Wednesday and lasts for 40 days. The forty days of Lent recall the 40 day fast of Jesus in the wilderness after his baptism (Matthew 4:2, Luke 4:1-2) and Moses' 40 day fast on Mount Sinai (Exodus 34:28). It is a time of simplicity and preparation.

#### **Principal Themes**

- Penitence
- Baptismal renewal
- Preparation for baptism at the Easter Vigil
- Prayer, fasting, and service
- Confession of sin rooted in the promise of God that comes through the cross of Christ



#### Color of the Season

Purple, suggesting somberness and solemnity.

#### Why don't we use Alleluias during Lent?

Because of the penitential character of the season of Lent, singing or saying the word "alleluia" has historically been suspended during Lent's forty days. This period of individual and congregational reflection on the quality of our baptismal faith and life suggests that the joyful nature of alleluia is more appropriately reserved for our Easter celebrations when it is given full and jubilant voice.

The omission of alleluia during Lent goes back at least to the fifth century in the western church. The custom of actually bidding it farewell, however, developed in the Middle Ages. The hymn "Alleluia, song of gladness" (*Evangelical Lutheran Worship* #318) contains a translation of an 11th century Latin text that compares an alleluia-less Lent to the exile of the Israelites in Babylon. The text then anticipates the joy of Easter when glad alleluias will return in all their heavenly splendor.



### **Mutual Ministry Team**

There needs to be a safe place in every congregation – a neutral zone if you will – where ANY member can come and talk about an issue in a non-biased atmosphere. And it was to fulfill this purpose that your Mutual Ministry Team was formed here at Shepherd of the Hills. We're wanting to advertise our services so that everyone knows where they can come if they need to talk about a church issue. . . . And by everyone we mean the pastor, church council members, the secretary or any SOTH member.

Your Mutual Ministry Team would like to be the "neutral zone" for anyone to come and talk about a church issue trusting that the issue and the discussion will be kept confidential. These issues could be something very positive about Shepherd of the Hills that a member wants to see continued, or it could be about a rumor someone heard and wants to hear the truth about, or it could be a very negative complaint about something going on in our church that a member wants to stop.

Just as importantly, the Mutual Ministry Team is a place for our church employees – pastor or secretary – to voice their concerns in a confidential environment. When one works for the church and is both a member and employed by the congregation, it is often difficult to get necessary feedback or to have a concern heard in a safe way. They need a neutral zone just as much as any other member. Overall, the Mutual Ministry Team's purpose is tending relationships amongst the body of Christ.

Please remember that SOTH has a Mutual Ministry Team at your disposal. You should contact the team chair, Lisa Hogbin, to schedule a meeting with the team at any time you have a concern or issue to discuss or you can speak privately with a team member. Members are: Kathy Jordan, Dave Elder, Martha Johnson, Jim Urnes and Mara Berry. The Mutual Ministry Team vows to listen in a non – judgmental way, further discuss the issue in private, then get back to you about the possible resolution of the issue. You'll hear and see more about us in the next couple of months, so stay tuned!
